

State Outreach Project



The career Montana FCCLA understands how important it is to choose careers wisely, which means investing in career exploration and preparation. After all, one;s career choice impacts so many areas of their lifestyle and their future! The Montana FCCLA State Outreach Project for 2025-26 is Career Connection, which means your chapters have so many opportunities to encourage career exploration and preparation in your local communities. Montana FCCLA chapters are eligible to receive a copy of the FCCLA National Program Career Connection, full of engaging activities to help chapters as they work to peer educate others about the importance of career preparation for a stronger future. Chapters are also encouraged to apply for mini-grants of up to \$200 to support community outreach projects designed to impact career exploration and preparation in local communities. Be sure to complete your State Outreach Project report by March 1 so that your chapter can showcase their Career Connection efforts and earn recognition. Vision Zero



Traffic safety is an issue that impacts everyone. Montana FCCLA and the Montana Department of Transportation have been partnering for years in an effort to include members in local traffic safety efforts. Our partnership continues into the 2025-26 year, with Vision Zero grants, awards, and presentations. Look for the Vision Zero workshops at your District Meetings, where chapters can learn the basics about implementing a successful chapter project! Chapter leaders will also learn more about this incredible opportunity at the Fall Leadership Rally. Watch for the Vision Zero Toolkit for Chapters coming soon! Develop plans now for your chapter's traffic safety outreach efforts. If you are not sure where to begin, check out some summaries from last year's projects at this link. Funding for projects is available, with a priority deadline of November 14 and a final deadline of December 5. After completing your project, be sure to submit the final report by March 1 to be eligible for state-level awards.

Is Your School Ready to Become a ProStart Program?

As we gear up for our annual ProStart Data Collection, we want to encourage all Montana schools offering culinary or hospitality coursework to consider becoming a Confirmed ProStart School. Whether you're already doing great things in your classroom or just beginning to explore culinary curriculum options, this is your opportunity to join a program that opens the door to valuable resources, support, and opportunities for your students.

What Is ProStart? It is a nationally recognized, career-focused culinary and hospitality program designed for high school students. It offers educators access to free curriculum, training, competitive opportunities, and direct connections to industry professionals. But you don't have to compete to be part of the program—you're likely already doing many of the required components in your classroom. Becoming a ProStart school is easier than you think!

Myth-Busting Alert: Think ProStart is only for schools with large programs or competitive teams? Think again! Click to view the Common ProStart Misconceptions Poster and see how attainable it is for your program to participate and begin their journey to preparation for a career in one of Montana's top industries! Ready to add ProStart? Here's What You Need to Do:

- Step 1: Watch for the ProStart Data Collection Form, coming your way soon.
- Step 2: If you're not already a confirmed program, fill out the Confirmed ProStart School Educator and Proctor Application (available now through October 1, 2025). Already a ProStart school? You're all set—just complete the data collection when it's released.

- Eligibility for student scholarships and competitions
- State and national recognition
- A strong, supportive professional network
- Increased funding and benefits for Montana schools through expanded participation

ProStart Certificate of Achievement



Have any of your students been working summer jobs?

Not sure? Ask them! Once students start returning to school, ask them about their summer and see if that includes working a summer job - specifically in the hospitality industry. If they have, they may be well on their way to earning a Certificate of Achievement (COA)! Students who work in the hospitality industry, help with catering events, work concessions at school, and many other related activities are unknowingly gaining invaluable skills that could be checked off a list to help them earn this COA. Some of the traits needed include: proper handwashing, showing up to work on time, measuring ingredients accurately, counting change back correctly, and many other things. While there are some specific technical and culinary skills on the list, it is not as intimidating and advanced as you might think. Earning this can set students apart from the competition in the job market for higher wages or jobs that are past entry-level. We as Montana ProStart will also recognize the efforts of these students at our State Leadership Conference.


2025-26 Membership Affiliation Options

Montana Chapters have four affiliation options to choose from. This includes three packages that allow Perkins Funding as payment to mitigate chapter fundraising and individual payment participation barriers for students and families, along with an option exclusively for middle-level chapters, serving students up to grade 9.



TRADITIONAL AFFILIATION

This is a continuation of past membership affiliation processes. Each student grades 6-12 who engages with or benefits from FCCLA programming is affiliated. Affiliation dues are paid from chapter fundraising or an individual/family fee.


